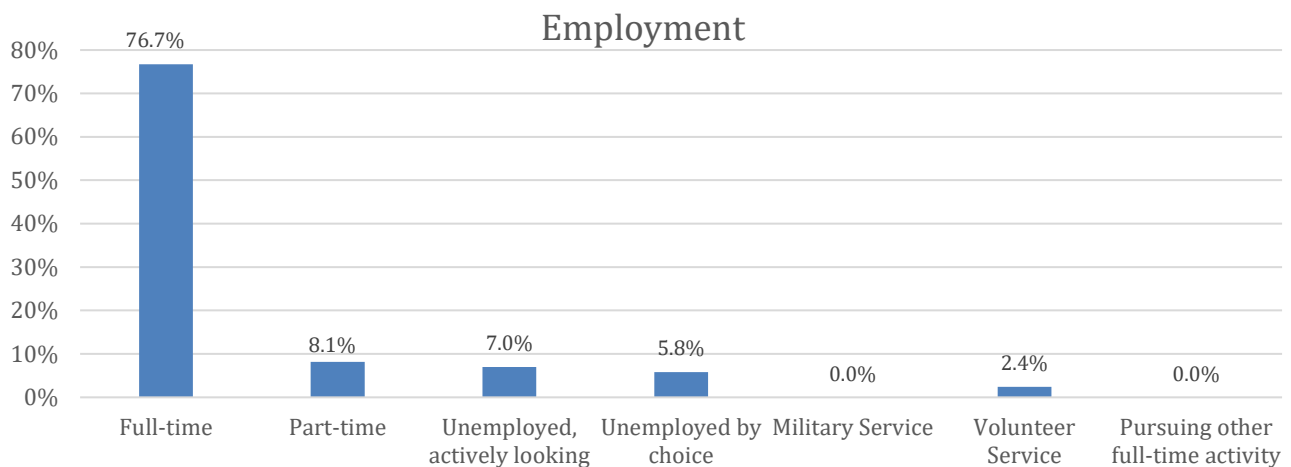




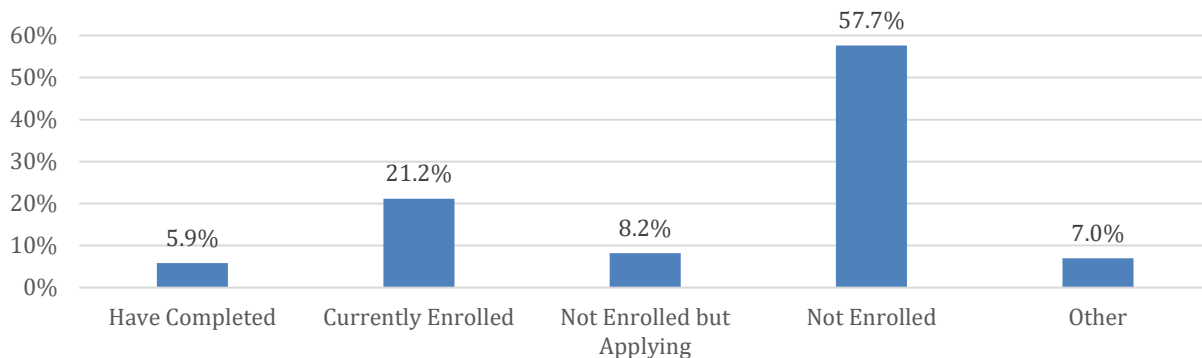
One and Five-Years-Out Survey of Graduates Class of 2022 and Class of 2018 Graduates Overall Executive Summary

In the summer of 2023, Saint Mary's College administered an online survey to alumnae who had graduated the previous year (Class of 2022) and five years prior (Class of 2018). Of the 363 Class of 2022 graduates surveyed, 94 responded for a response rate of 26%. Of the 379 total Class of 2018 graduates surveyed, 135 responded for a response rate of 36%. The goal of these annual surveys is to better understand the outcomes of our graduates.

Employment and Graduate School Attendance for the Class of 2022 (One-Year-Out)

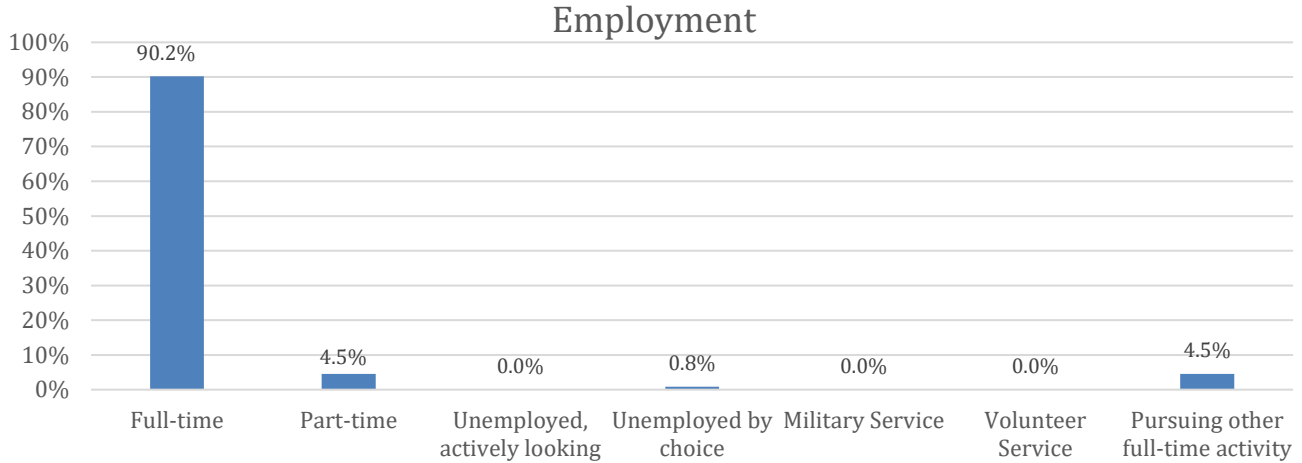


Professional or Graduate School

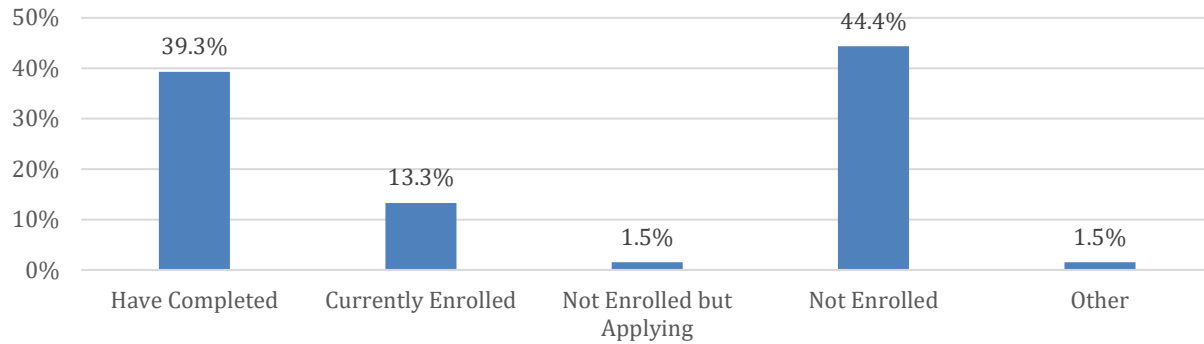


- One-year out, 92.9% of 2022 graduates reported being employed full-time, enrolled in graduate/professional school, volunteer service, or pursuing other full-time activities.
- 12.9% of graduates one-year out reported being employed full-time or part-time, AND enrolled in graduate/professional school.

Employment and Graduate School Attendance for the Class of 2018 (Five-Years-Out)



Professional or Graduate School



- Five-years out, 95.6% of 2018 graduates reported being employed full-time, enrolled in or have completed graduate/professional school, volunteer service, or pursuing other full-time activities.
- 8.3% of graduates five-years out reported being employed full-time AND currently enrolled in graduate/professional school.
- 37.9% of graduates are currently employed AND have completed graduate or professional school.

- Graduates five-years out are more likely to be employed full-time largely due to the prevalence of graduates one-year out who are enrolled in graduate/professional school who also hold part-time employment.

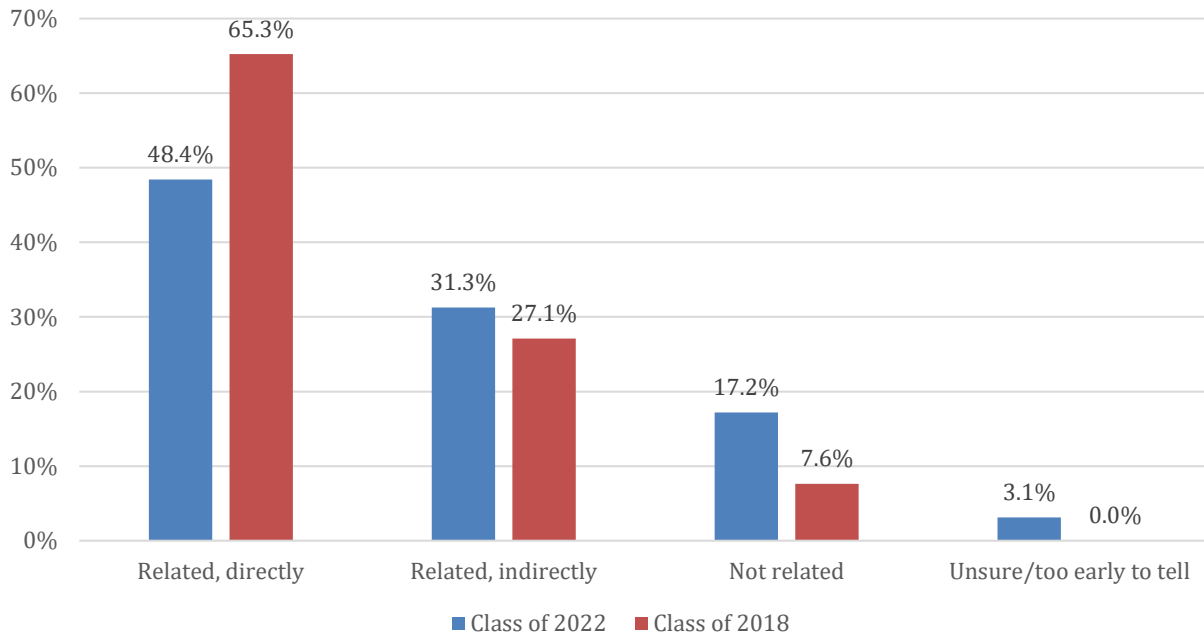

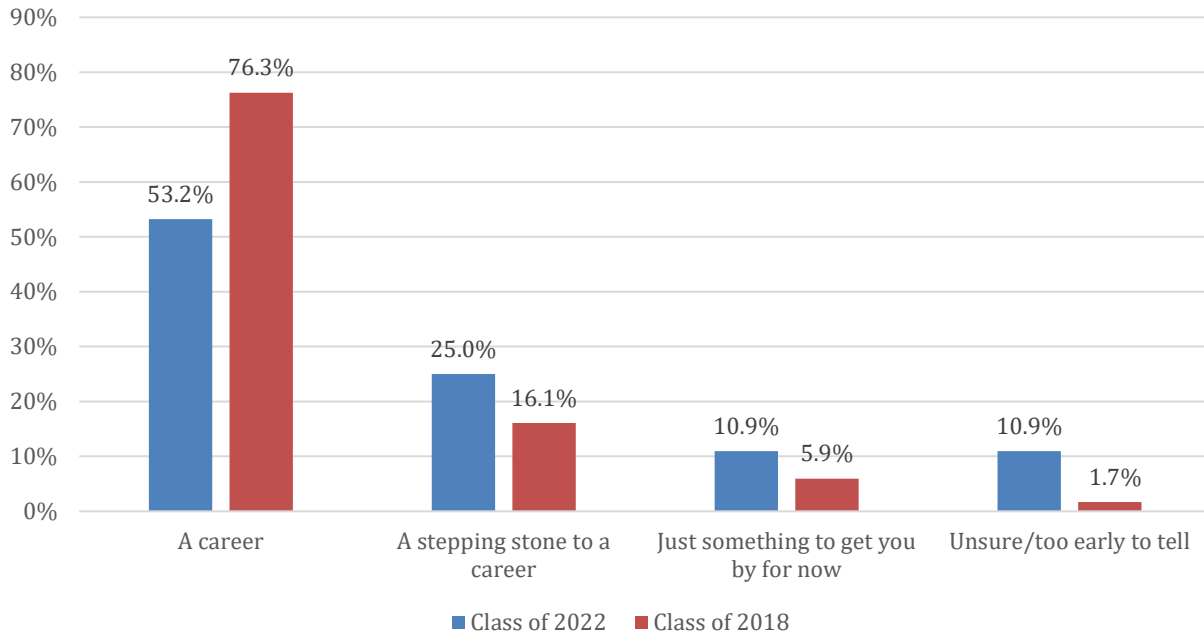
- At one-year out, less than 9% of the Class of 2018 graduates reported earning \$70,000 or more. Five years later, the percentage of the Class of 2018 reported earning \$70,000 or more increased to more than 62%.

To what extent is your current job related to your major(s) at Saint Mary's?



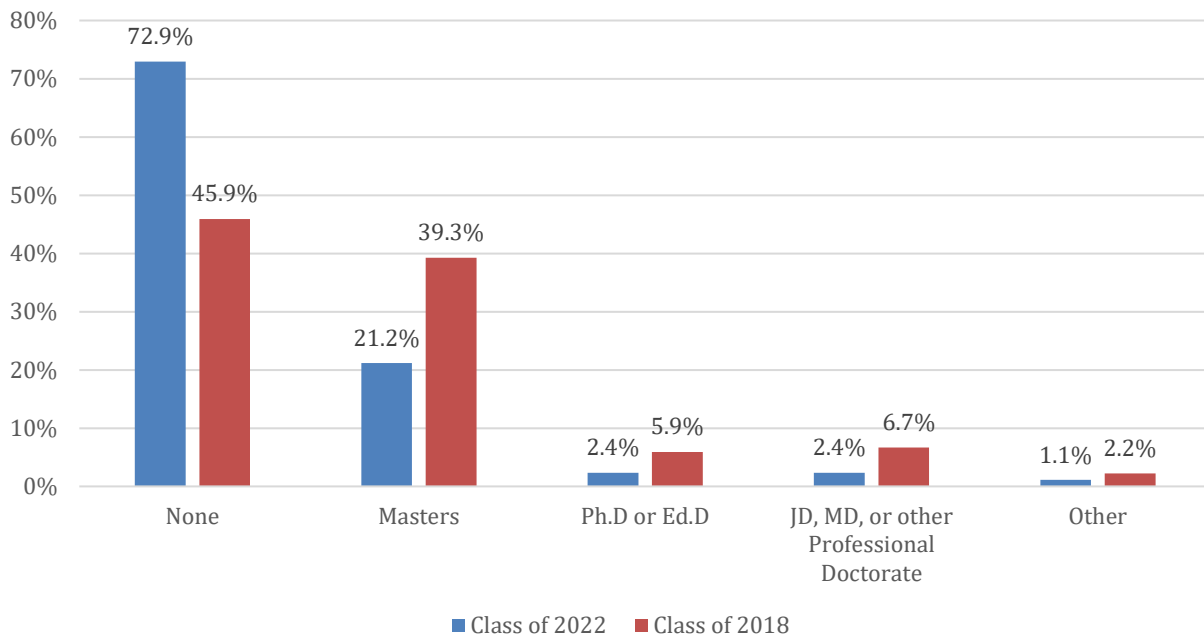
- 92.4% of the 2018 graduates and 79.7% of the 2022 graduates indicated their current job is related, either directly or indirectly, to their major(s) at Saint Mary's.

When thinking of your current job, is it:

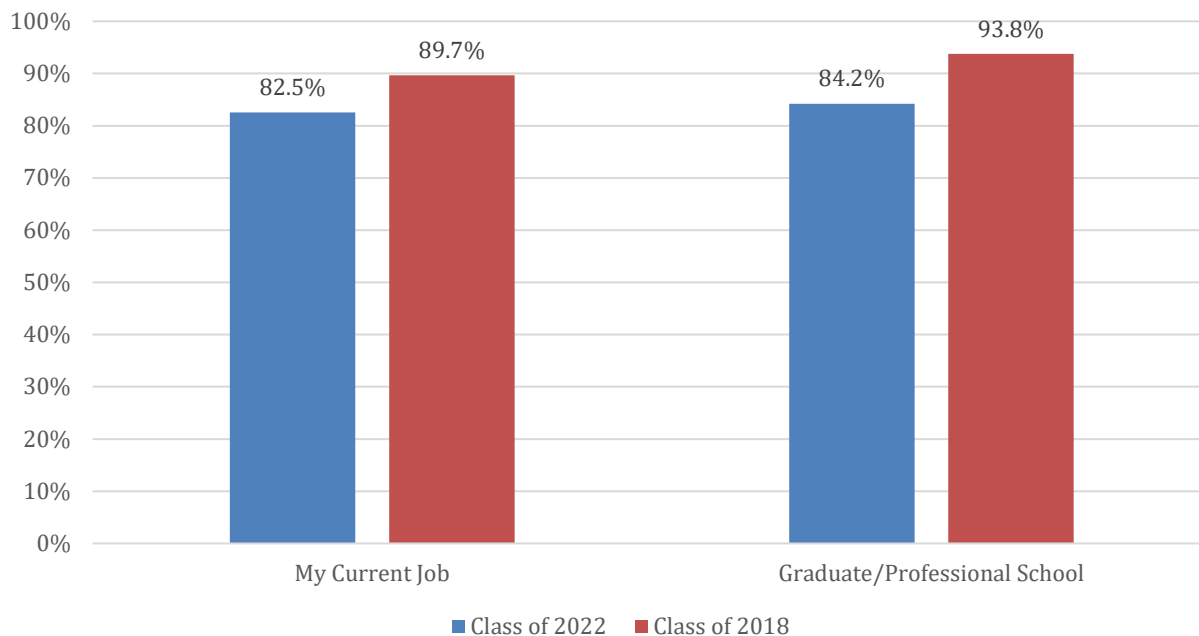


- 76.3% of the respondents from the class of 2018 and 53.1% of the respondents from the class of 2022 indicate that they consider their current position a career.

Degree Pursued



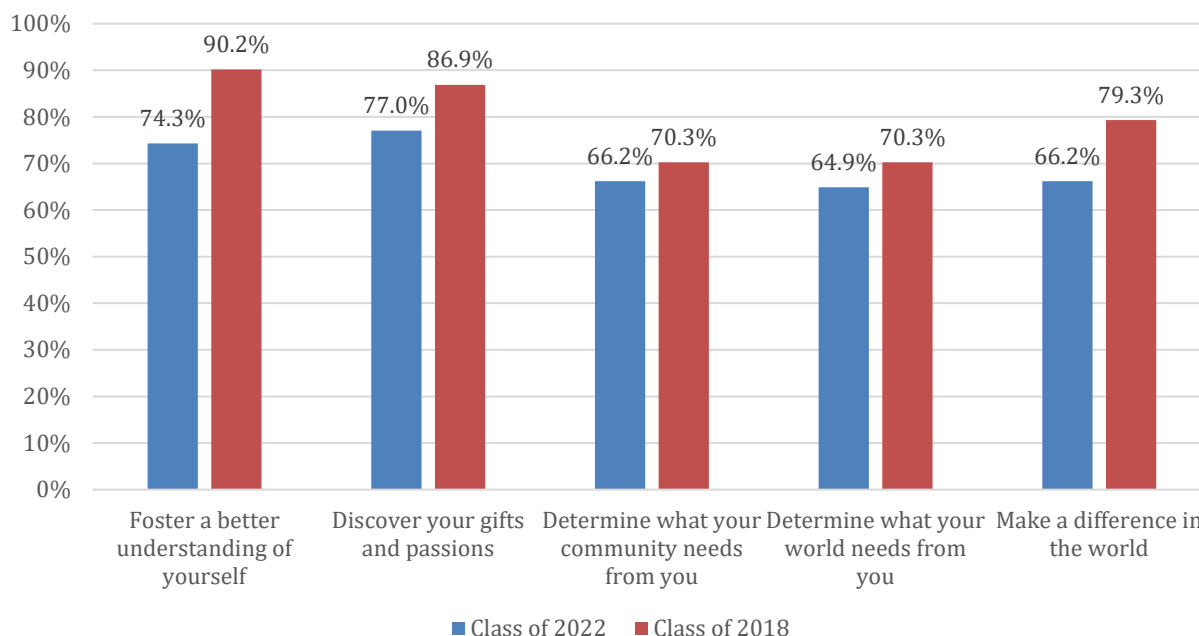
Saint Mary's College Prepared Me Well For: (% Well or Very Well)



- More than 84% of 2018 graduates indicate that Saint Mary's prepared them well or very well for their current job and/or graduate school. More than 82% of 2022 graduates indicated that Saint Mary's prepared them well or very well for graduate/professional school or their current job.

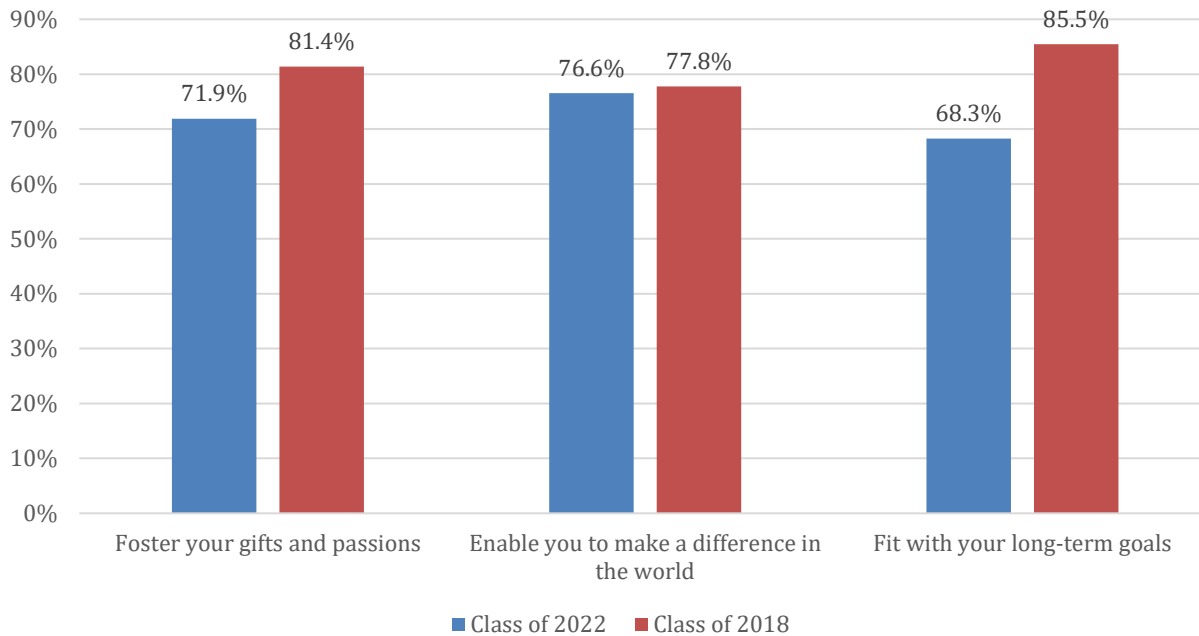
Educational and Professional Fulfillment

To what extent did your Saint Mary's education help you: (% Well or Very Well)



- More than 90% of graduates from the class of 2018 and 74% of graduates from the class of 2022 reported that their Saint Mary's education has helped them foster a better understanding of themselves. More than 60% of the classes of 2018 and 2022 indicated their education accomplished core aspects of the College's mission such as preparing them to make a difference in the world and determining the needs of their communities and the world.

To what extent does your current job: (% Well or Very Well)



- More than 71% of respondents from the classes of 2022 and 2018 indicate that their current job allows them foster their gifts and passions and also enable them to make a difference in the world. More than 68% of the class of 2022 graduates reported that their current job fits well or very well with their long-term career goals. Over 85% of class of 2018 reported that their current job fits well or very well with their long-term career goals.
